Back to work after the summer break!

The CPC met again after our summer break and we are looking forward to the year ahead. A few highlights are set out below:

Churt 2035

You may recall that we are seeking the views of Churt residents on the upsides and downsides of, and opportunities for, the village for the next few years. We have been interested and encouraged by the responses received so far but we have decided to reach out for further input now that the summer season has come to an end. We shall we contacting local organisations individually and we would still be delighted to received input from anyone who has not yet had the opportunity to fill in the survey - this is the link to follow http://forms.office.com/e/SnNWfpDCAU.

We shall continue to analyse the responses and, to the extent change is within the capacity of the CPC, we shall try to reflect these in the Churt 2035 proposals.

Surrey Hills National Landscape (AONB) Boundary Variation Project. A further round of consultation is being undertaken for extending the Surrey Hills National Landscape into parts of East Hampshire, notably:

• Ludshott and Bramshott Commons and Cooper's Stream

- Southwest valley side of Whitmoor Vale
- Slea and Wey Valleys and Hills (addition to the Dockenfield Hills Extension Area)

The consultation lasts for 12 weeks and was launched on 17^{th} September. Given the proximity of the East Hants areas we would encourage anyone potentially affected to engage with the consultation.
